





CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR CO-FINANCING STUDENT MOBILITY FOR STUDIES AND TRAINEESHIPS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARIBOR, ERASMUS+ (KA71) – INTERNATIONAL CREDIT MOBILITY, 2023/2024 ACADEMIC YEAR – SUMMER SEMESTER

To apply for this call, you have to observe the application deadlines of your home university!

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

The Erasmus+ programme enables students to complete a part of their regular study obligations at any level or cycle (including the preparation of diploma, master or doctoral theses, but excluding research, which is not a direct study obligation) at an international partner institution (in this case the University of Maribor) instead of at the home institution.

Partner higher education (sending) institutions are institutions from partner countries who have concluded an Erasmus+ Institutional Agreement with the University of Maribor (hereinafter: UM) for student mobility for studies.

Students from a partner institution may apply for mobility to the UM. In the framework of this call, mobility from all listed partner institutions to the UM will be co-financed within the given range of financial means.

Students may also apply as zero-grant students and they will not obtain any financial grant.

Studies at the UM must last a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 12 months. Traineeships must last a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 12 months.

Students, who will obtain financial means in the framework of this call, may apply for mobility for one semester.

This call enables applications for mobility for studies at the UM in the period from 1st August 2022 to 31st July 2026.

2. BASIC CONDITIONS

Students meeting the basic requirements for the status of an »Erasmus+ Student« foreseen by the programme, may apply for this call. These requirements are:

- Students must be enrolled in the home institution for the entire duration of the study period abroad.
- In the 2023/2024 academic year, students must be enrolled at least in the second year of undergraduate studies.
- Students must not exceed the maximum of 12 months of mobility in the framework of Erasmus LLP, Erasmus Mundus, and Erasmus+ at the same level of studies (in which they will be enrolled in the 2022/2023 academic year) together with the planned mobility. Students of one-cycle programmes (5-or 6-year programmes) must not exceed 24 months of mobility.

The period of studies abroad must be a part of the study programme of the student of the first cycle (undergraduate or equal), second cycle (master level or equivalent) and third or doctoral cycle .

Based on this call, a student may apply only for one mobility.

Students, who have outstanding financial obligations under the programmes Erasmus LLP, Erasmus Mundus, and Erasmus+, may not apply for this call.

Students may not carry out the mobility in the country of the sending institution, in the country country where they reside or have their permanent residence during their studies, in the country where they were born or in any country of their citizenship.

<u>Students must reside in the city of the host institution for the entire duration of the Erasmus+ studies!</u> The UM may request proof of stay at any time: a copy of a rental contract in the place of studies for the total period of studies, registration at the foreigners' office in the place of studies abroad, confirmation of payment of rent, etc.

Study obligations agreed before departure by the student and the sending and receiving institutions in the Learning Agreement for Studies that will be performed by the student at the partner institution abroad will be recognized at the home institution after their return. Information about recognition will be sent to the UM on the Recognition Certificate by the sending institution by 31st July 2024 at the latest.

Recognition of successfully passed obligations may be rejected only if the student did not achieve the requested level of knowledge/skills demanded by the receiving institution or did not fulfil other agreed obligations and conditions for recognition.

A condition of the Erasmus+ programme is that all obligations passed during Erasmus+ studies abroad have to be recognized <u>at least</u> by <u>entrance into the Diploma Supplement.</u>

Based on the Decision of the UM Senate, in order to be eligible for a financial grant, students must have acquired at least:

- 10 ECTS per trimester (3 months)
- 20 ECTS per semester (6 months)
- 40 ECTS per academic year (12 months)

3. FINANCIAL GRANT

Students receive individual support and travel support.

Travel support depends on the distance between the registered office of the home institution and the place of destination and is approved based on actual costs, but to the maximum of the amounts in Table 1.

Table 1 – Travel costs – maximum amounts regarding the distance between the registered office of the home institution and the place of destination

Travel distances must be calculated using the distance calculator supported by the European Commission (<u>http://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/tools/distance_en.htm</u>). The distance of a one-way travel must be used to calculate the amount of the EU grant that will support the round trip.

Green travel

Green travel is defined as travel that uses low-emission means of transport, such a bus, train or car sharing, for the majority of the travel.

Students who opt for a green travel will receive up to 4 days of additional individual support to cover travel days for a return trip, if relevant.

The Erasmus+ grant only co-finances the costs of mobility. The amount of the monthly Erasmus+ grant is awarded based on Table 2.

The grant may be given only for the time of duration of regular study obligations or traineeship in line with the academic calendar at the receiving institution.

UM can co-finance only the mobility for the purpose of studies or traineeships according to the available means in Table 3.

The start date of the Erasmus+ activity (which the student must enter in the application) is the first day the student must be present at the host institution. This can be, e.g., the start date of the first course/first working day, a welcome event organised by the host institution or a language and intercultural course.

The end date of the Erasmus+ activity (which the student must enter in the application) is the last day the student must be present at the host institution. This can be, e.g., the last day of the exam period/lectures/work/compulsory attendance.

If the UM receives more complete applications than there are available financial funds or places for studies and/or traineeships for partner countries in the 2023/2024 academic year, the UM will conduct a <u>selection procedure</u> <u>based on following criteria</u>:

40% – Academic success of the student in the past academic years

30% – Motivation letter

30% – CV with described additional activities

The first level of the selection procedure must be conducted at the sending institution. After the selection procedure is completed, the **Erasmus+ coordinator** of the sending institution will send nominations and all required documentation to the UM via e-mail to the e-mail address: <u>icm@um.si</u>.

Priority will be given to disadvantaged students.

The UM will strive for equal representation of all partner institutions. If there are still some funds left at the end of this call, another call for applications will be published.

Students applying for this call will be notified of the results of the selection procedures and all further procedures to their electronic address stated in their application.

Special needs students carrying out Erasmus+ mobility may apply for additional financial support.

4. APPLICATION

Before applying for the call, students shall check the list of partner institutions, fields and levels of study in the table of inter-institutional agreements. The sending home institution must be a partner university of the University of Maribor.

Students shall also check <u>internal procedures</u> for the application for mobility for a study period abroad <u>at the</u> <u>sending home institution</u>.

The application has to contain:

1. <u>Application form</u> with <u>Learning Agreement</u> please note that it is obligatory to use our documents from the following webpage: <u>https://studentexchange.um.si/</u> (mobility type: CREDIT MOBILITY!). The document has to be confirmed by the student and the Erasmus+ coordinator or responsible person at the department or faculty and the Erasmus+ institutional coordinator or responsible person of the sending institution.*

2. <u>Transcript of Records</u> for all passed exams for all levels of study with an <u>average grade</u>.

3. <u>Confirmation of English language knowledge</u> (a minimum of B1 level) in line with CEFR (http://www.coe.int/t/dg4/linguistic/cadre1_en.asp). Knowledge of English language is proven by a verified confirmation (Attachment 1) by an English teacher at the home institution or by a TOEFL result of 42 (IBT) or more, IELTS 4.0 or more, or by another equivalent certificate.

4. A signed <u>Declaration on previously conducted student mobility (Attachment 2).</u>

5. A signed Declaration on country of residence, birth and citizenship (Attachment 3).

6. A Motivation letter up to a max. 1 A4 page signed by the applicant.

7. <u>Curriculum Vitae (Europass) with described additional activities (Attachment 4).</u>

8. A valid Certificate of Enrolment.

9. A copy of a valid personal document (passport or ID).

10. A claim for establishing a unique personal number – EMŠO: personal identification number (Attachment 5).

11. A GDPR statement for giving consent for using personal data (Attachment 6).

*Students applying for the preparation of a diploma, master, or doctoral thesis also have to attach the »Mobility Activity Plan« (Attachment 7) confirmed by the student and the Erasmus+ coordinator or other responsible person at the sending institution.

All documents have to be in PDF, JPG, PNG or TIF format.

The complete application is to be sent to the Erasmus+ coordinator or other responsible person of the International Relations Office of the home institution from the list of Erasmus partner institutions (Attachment 8).

Deadline for applications to the UM SUMMER SEMESTER 2023/2024: 1ST DECEMBER 2023

5. ZERO-GRANT APPLICATION

Erasmus+ status brings along other benefits besides the grant. In particular, Erasmus+ students are exempt form paying tuition and receiveother benefits connected to the student status abroad. Therefore, a student, who does not get any financial grant and wishes to undertake the Erasmus+ experience anyway, may also apply for mobility.
